GRANT WOOD LOOP/HOMETOWN PRIDE

Recreation is one of the top three influencers for young families considering a place to live. Jackson County has a uniquely beautiful landscape with incredible recreation opportunities. The Parks to People pilot project allowed us to build on regional collaboration to share Jackson County's message and leverage State dollars with other private and local public dollars in our Grant Wood Loop region. After closing that pilot project out we've partnered with Keep Iowa Beautiful's Hometown Pride Program to provide additional community development and coaching services to the region. We also are working with the University of Iowa's School of the Wild to integrate outdoor environmental education in our region's grade school curriculum.
